# Workshop Session One

**1:15 p.m.—Wednesday, October 20**

**1A. Driver Licensing Issues:** This workshop will offer insight to the latest developments in the Bureau of Driver Licensing, PA Department of Transportation. It will focus on court and legislative matters affecting driver's license suspension for DUI offenders as well as matters regarding ignition interlock. Participants will have ample opportunity to ask questions. This workshop is a must for anyone dealing with the DUI offender. *Presenter: Brenda Collins, Bureau of Driver Licensing, PENNDOT.*

**1B. From Passion to Power:** You get more, when you get together! In this workshop, you will discover how to involve intergenerational audiences with multiple strategies in multiple locations, track the role of media and law enforcement in prevention efforts, do the Data Dance for state-of-the-art evaluation and online data collection systems and explore resources for sustainability, as you promote prevention communities. *Presenter: Nora Drexler, National Project Director, Lead and Seed.*

**1C. Marijuana: Palliative or Poison -** So what is marijuana and what are the issues that create such definite combative positions that seem to make a common plant an angel of mercy or a devil of death and misery? This workshop will survey the broad areas of production, marketing, pricing, distribution and use of marijuana – both medical and non-medical. Topics include chemical ingredients, potency, methods of use, body retention, symptoms of use and abuse, issues of addiction and withdrawal, motivations of use, connections with other illegal drugs, and the various acute and long-term effects of use. The medical marijuana controversy will be discussed, with emphasis on the comparison of Marinol with marijuana, the dangers of marijuana as a “medicine”, the “medical” treatment of children and adolescents, and the issue of drugged driving and marijuana use. *Presenter: Gene Stull, STAC Associates.*

**1D. Toxicology of Drug Testing:**

This presentation is geared toward the unique challenges to obtaining and presenting forensic evidence in Drug DUI cases. Dr. Logan explains the necessary steps in sample collection, and the process used to identify controlled substances and their metabolites in a blood sample. Unlike Alcohol DUI, the testing process is different for various types of drugs. Learn how a toxicologist can interpret test results in conjunction with a DRE evaluations and the observations of the arresting officer. Special attention is paid to the toxicology and effects of marijuana. *Presenter: Dr. Barry Logan, National Director, Toxicology and Forensic Services, NMS Labs.*

# Workshop Session Two

**3:00 p.m.—Wednesday, October 20**

**2A. Case Law Update:** This workshop is designed to present, interpret and discuss constitutional issues related to traffic, and drug and alcohol-related enforcement activities. Issues to be discussed include: DUI case law; implied consent, standardized field sobriety testing, Miranda issues, police liability and current decisions relating to officer safety issues. *Presenter: Detective Frank Baranyai, Cambridge Springs Police Department.*

**2B. Buying Beer at Sheetz: An Overview of Pennsylvania**

**Beer Laws:** This workshop will present a comprehensive overview of the recent beer license that was extended to Sheetz at their Altoona Convenience Restaurant. Sheetz will present lessons learned about selling beer to adults in Pennsylvania. They will also review why Sheetz advocates for changes in the Pennsylvania beer sales laws. A review of Sheetz sales associate training will be presented detailing Sheetz policies and procedures for selling alcohol for all age restricted products. *Presenter: Louie Sheetz, Executive VP, Marketing.*

**2C. What's New in Drugs—2010 :** Law enforcement officers, treatment specialists, and many other professionals encounter illegal drugs, abused legal drugs, drug paraphernalia and concealed drugs frequently during routine enforcement and supervisory activities. Few challenges are as varied as attempting to keep up with the innovations of the drug user and seller, it is difficult at best to be alert for the changing trends, substances, abuses, tools, and compartments associated with the drug culture. This workshop will focus on the new and the different as encountered throughout the nation, and particularly the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Topics will include legal and illegal drugs used and abused, recognition of various illegal substances, changes in the paraphernalia used with various drugs, hidden compartments and personal hiding places, and safety issues. This is not a drug enforcement class, but rather a drug recognition and understanding session, with hundreds of visuals. *Presenter: Gene Stull, STAC Associates.*

# Workshop Session Five

**1:45 p.m.—Thursday, October 21**

**5A. Prescription Drugs and Driving:** According to the Kaiser Family Foundation's recent study on prescription drug use, the average American takes fifteen prescriptions a year! Of particular concern with our aging population, mature drivers using prescription drugs are at a very high risk of being impaired by these drugs when they are driving. Objectives of this presentation are:

1. Raise awareness to prescription drug abuse
2. Make healthcare aware of the need to properly and thoroughly counsel patients when prescribing to them a new drug that may have the potential to cause impairment
3. Raise the awareness of the widespread polydrug impaired driving problem within our mature population and the potential consequences. *Presenter: George Geisler, Jr., DRE, Law Enforcement Services, PA DUI Association.*

**5B. Mastering the Preliminary Hearing:** This presentation is designed to provide police officers and newer prosecutors with the tools to effectively present a criminal case before an MDJ. The Pennsylvania Rules of Evidence and Rules of Criminal Procedure are discussed and explained, along with the standard of proof at a preliminary hearing. Course materials also include references to court decisions, tips for testifying, and suggested strategies for success. Specific attention is paid to the presentation of evidence in a DUI case. The goal of this workshop is to help the officer understand the process, and approach their next court appearance with confidence. *Presenter: Max Little, TSRP, PA District Attorneys Institute.*

**5C. Liquor Laws:** Todd Merlina, an Enforcement Supervisor for the Pa. State Police Bureau of Liquor Control Enforcement will present information regarding the Liquor Laws in Pennsylvania and how the Bureau of Liquor Control Enforcement can provide assistance to Law Enforcement agencies and Communities affected by violators. This block of instruction will discuss the responsibilities of Liquor Licensees and the individuals employed in the serving industry. *Presenter: Todd Merlina, Enforcement Supervisor, PA State Police, Bureau of Liquor Control Enforcement.*

**5D. What's In Your Tool Box?:** Today's Millennials learn differently than generations before them. This session will look at a variety of tools available to engage youth in Underage Drinking Classes. Come ready to play and have fun. *Presenter: Felicity DeBacco Erni, Executive Director, PA SADD.*
